- e) Why is the West wind called both 'destroyer' and 'preserver'?
- f) "Through the sad heart of Ruth, when sick for home..." Who is Ruth? Why is she sick for home?
- g) "Of some fierce Maenad" Who is "Maenad"? What is compared to 'Maenad'?
- h) What are the "songs of Spring"?
- i) "Watching, with eternal leads apart" What is the speaker 'watching' and why?
- j) "- or else swoon to death"- Why does the speaker feel so?
- k) Who is described as "close bosom-friend" and why?
- l) Who is Kubla Khan? Where did he live?

- n) "We in ourselves rejoice" Who are referred to as "We"? Why do they 'rejoice'?
