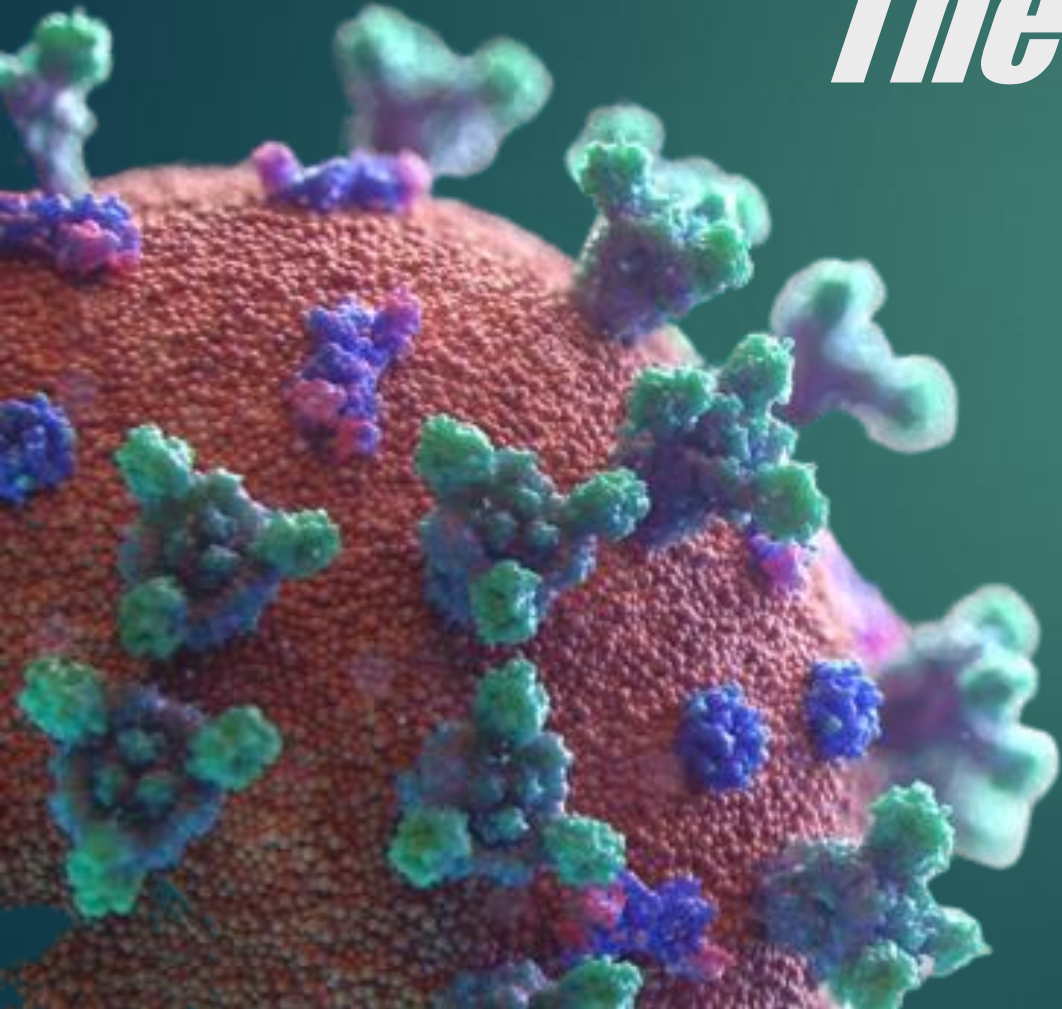


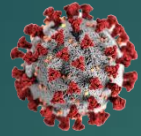

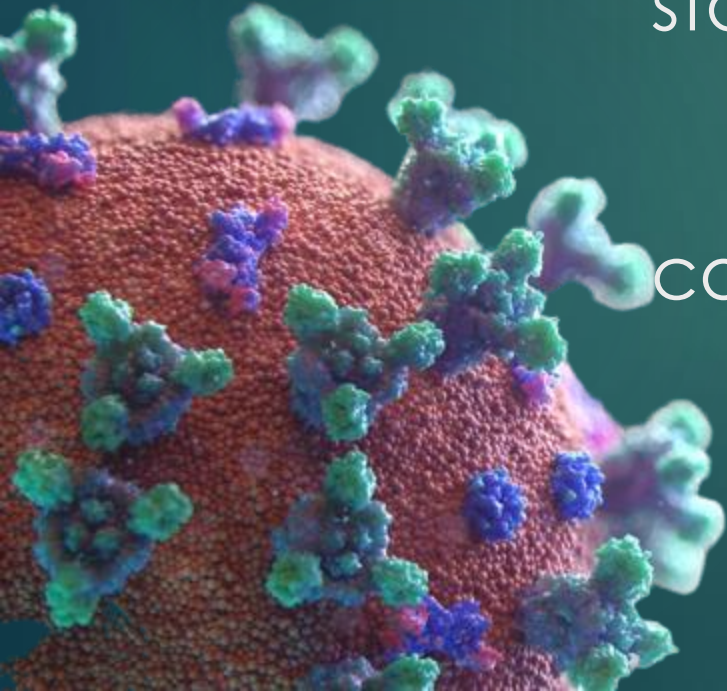
□ What is COVID-19 ?

The virus is widely spreading across all the countries causing many death.





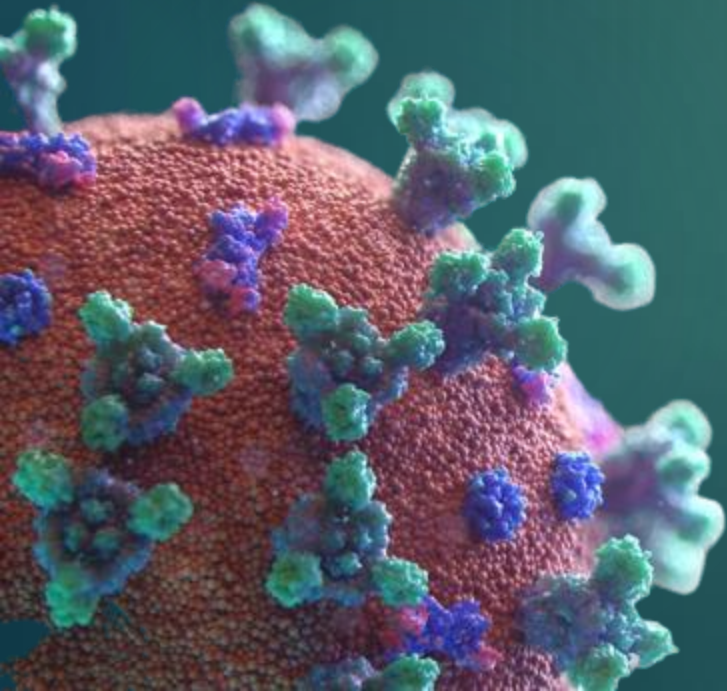
Symptoms

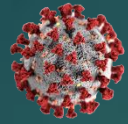
- Fever

- Work from home

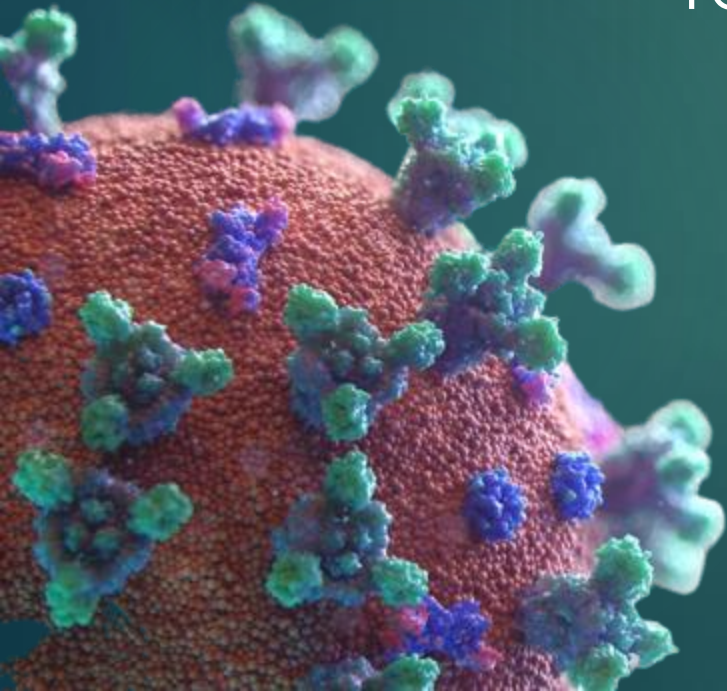


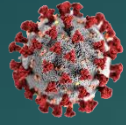


Spread

The corona virus is luckily to emerge from animal source.

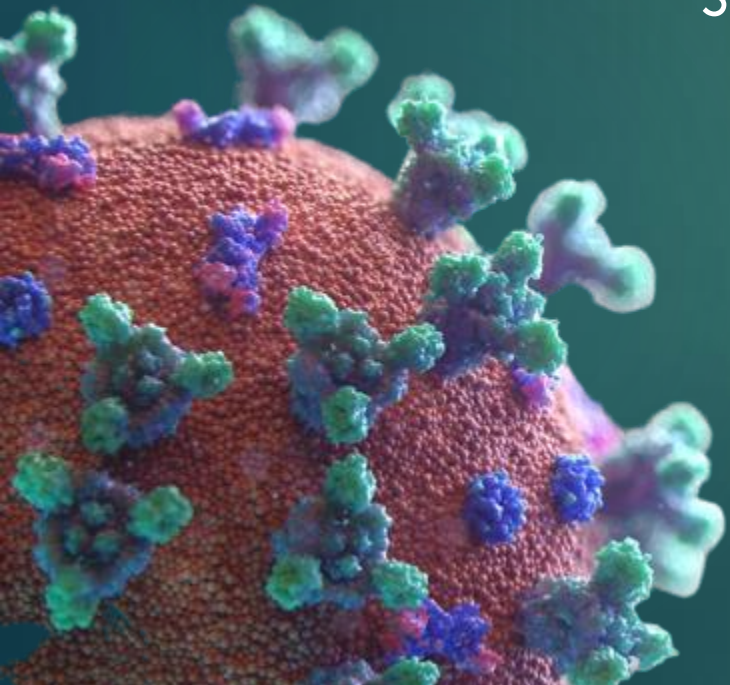
The virus is spreading between the humans who are within 6 feet of distance and who emit respiratory droplets through cough and sneeze.





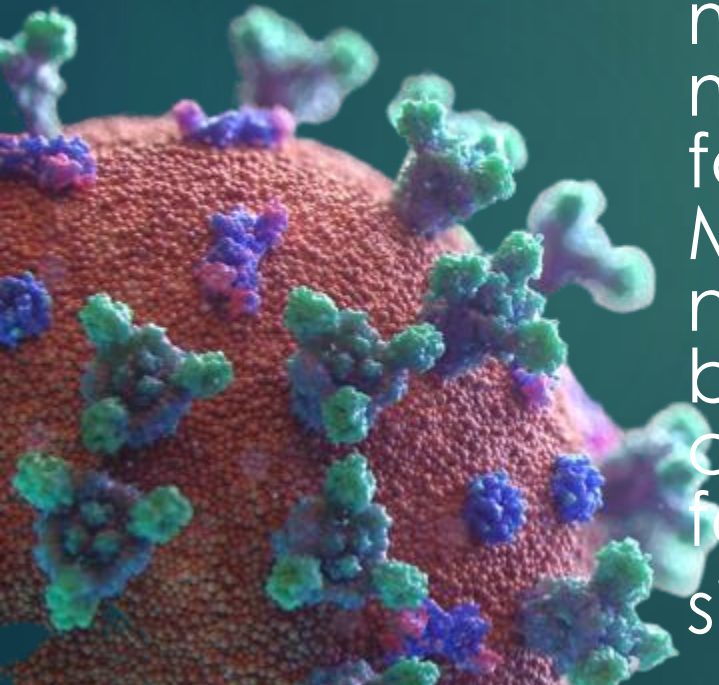
Impact

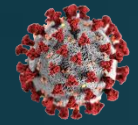
Macro economic and financial outcomes of the corona virus have materialized in just three weeks, in comparison to the three years this took for the 2008 financial crisis .Markets are down 35%, credit market seized up, and credit spreads have spiked to 2008 levels.



□ Effect On Students

Students are not the face of this pandemic. But they risk being among its biggest victims. While they have thankfully been largely spared from the direct health effects of COVID-19 at least to date the crisis is having a profound effect on their wellbeing. All students, of all ages, and in all countries, are being affected, in particular by the socio-economic impacts and, in some cases, by mitigation measures that may inadvertently do more harm than good. This is a universal crisis and, for some students, the impact will be lifelong. Moreover, the harmful effects of this pandemic will not be distributed equally. They are expected to be most damaging for students in the poorest countries, and in the poorest neighborhoods, and for those in already disadvantaged or vulnerable situations.

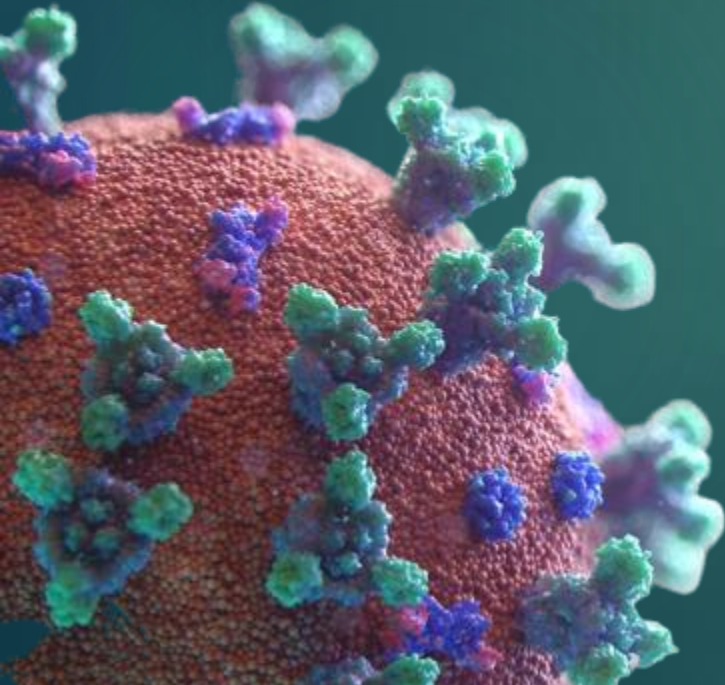




Student's education classification

➤ Primary education

Primary education starts from the age of 6. School is a holistic environment, where apart from studies, social skills are developed through sports and social interaction with other children. But the students were deprived of all these as all the schools were closed during the pandemic time. 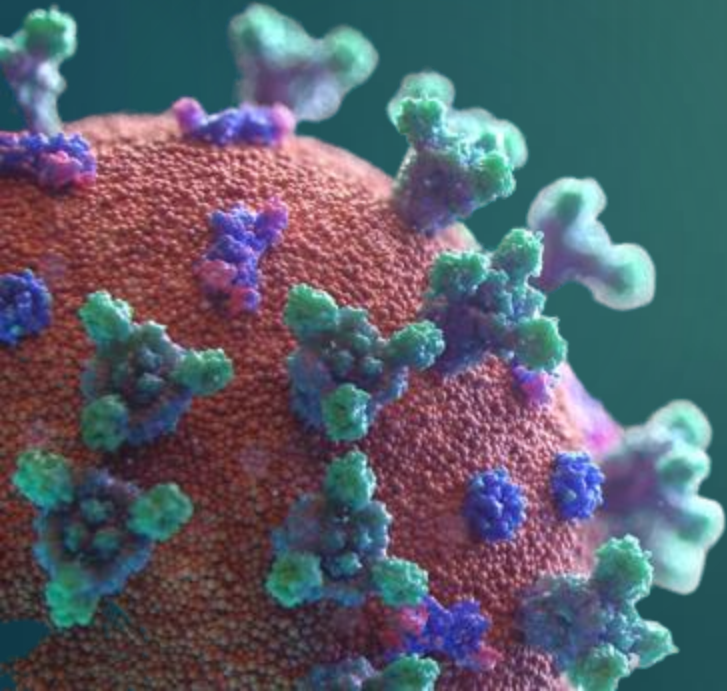


➤ Higher Secondary Education

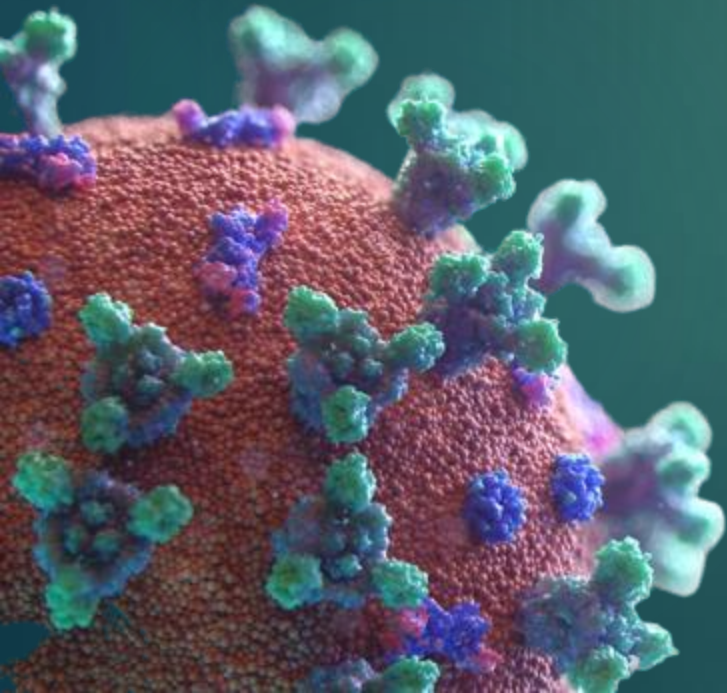


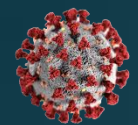

➤ Higher Education

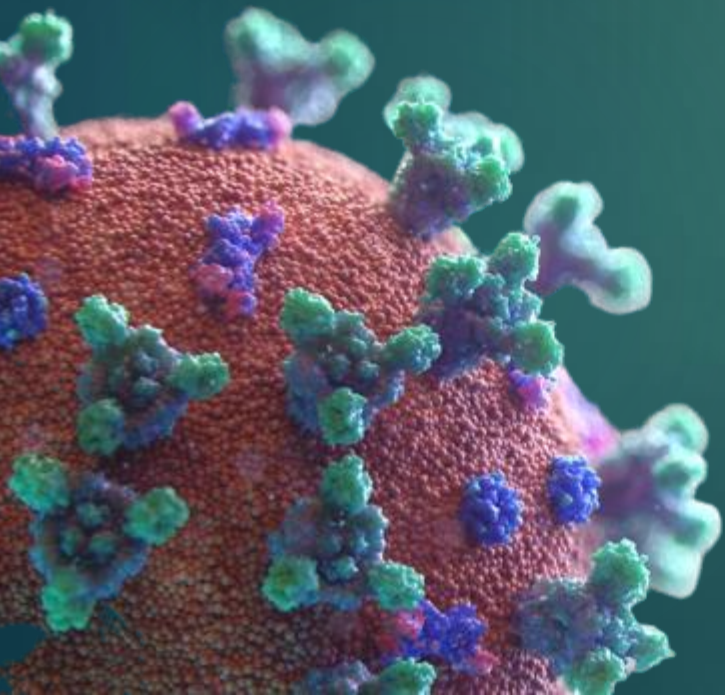

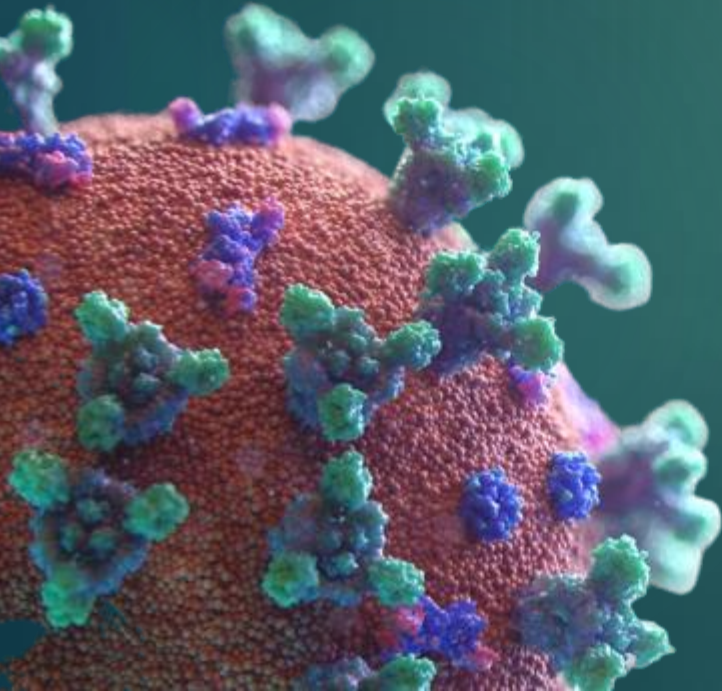


Editorial Column

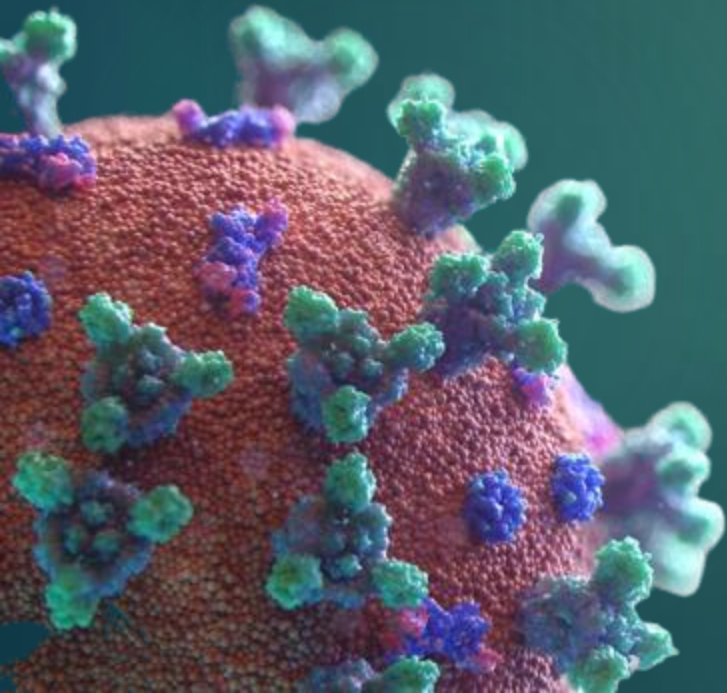
